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Charitable Giving Considerations **for 2021**

If the COVID-19 pandemic's far-reaching impacts have you look-
ing to enhance your charitable giving, be sure to remember these
tax-related considerations for 2021:Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). For taxpayers age
70½ or older, a QCD allows you to gift up to \$100,000 per year
directly from your IRA to qualifying charities.

Cash gifts. A special rule for this year allows taxpayers who do
not itemize deductions to claim up to \$300 (\$600 for joint filers)QCDs are tax-free distributions and count toward satisfying your
required minimum distribution (RMD). Remember that, while
RMDs were waived for 2020, they must be taken for 2021.

CAR-0720-03330 If you do itemize, cash contributions to qualified charities in 2021 might be used to offset up to 100% of your adjusted gross income (AGI) (60% of AGI for cash gifts to a donor-advised fund or 30% for cash gifts to a private foundation).

This means that if you're in a position to make generous gifts, you may potentially offset all of your taxable income. In addition, cash gifts could be used to offset Roth IRA conversion income or capital gains realized upon the sale of real estate or a large position in a single investment.

If you're unable to itemize but would like to, evaluate the possible impact of bunching several years' worth of charitable contributions into one year. This may increase your itemized deductions above the standard deduction threshold so you can potentially receive a tax benefit for those gifts. Review your income and deductions for the current year and the next few years with your tax advisor to determine what is the best timing for those bunched contributions.

No deduction is allowed for a QCD since the distribution is not taxable. This strategy is beneficial if you will not itemize deductions this year. It could also help you control your AGI, which is used to determine many tax-related limitations.

Note that the amount of the QCD you are able to exclude from your income is reduced by any deductible IRA contributions you make in the year you reach age $70\frac{1}{2}$ or after.

Stock gifts. Gifting stock directly to charity rather than selling it and contributing the proceeds provides a current tax benefit if you itemize deductions. In addition, it lets you avoid capital gains taxation on the stock's appreciation if it increased in value while you owned it. Deductions for stock gifts are limited to 30% of AGI when contributing to public charities.

How to *Reduce* Commissions When **Buying Mutual Funds**

Mutual funds are simply portfolios of investments - stocks, bonds, or both - selected to meet a defined investment objective. There are thousands of mutual funds and their objectives vary greatly, so you can select growth funds, value funds, bond funds, blends, or thematic funds such as ESG funds. Fund companies offer a variety of options when it comes to purchasing them.

One of these options is a standardized front-end sales charge to compensate brokers in commission-based accounts. These are referred to as 'A' shares of the fund, and the sales charge is immediately deducted from your investment upon purchase.



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You may be surprised that Morningstar's "Descriptions of Share Class Types," describes "A-shares" as "usually the most cost-effective for long-term investors using a commission-based broker." Why? Because if you're going to buy and hold the investment for several years, it may be most cost-effective to pay the one-time sales charge on the initial investment, get it out of the way.

Chances are, you may own A-shares from one or more major investment firms such as Fidelity, American Funds, T. Rowe Price (or hundreds of other providers). What I wanted to share is how to potentially reduce your commission expenses in these types of accounts.

Reduce Commissions Using Breakpoints

Breakpoints are simply a standardized schedule of reduced sales charges based on the amount invested with the mutual fund company in total, not just one of their funds. For example, most stock mutual funds may charge 5.75% up to a \$25,000 purchase. However, the entire sales charge is reduced the more you invest with them. If you are buying several funds from one fund company, you can add all of them together to determine your breakpoint.

Breakpoints are commonly offered at \$25k, \$50k, \$100k, \$250k, \$500k, and \$750k. At \$1,000,000 sales charges are usually 0%.

If you invested \$25,000 of A-shares with 4 different mutual fund companies, the commission on each would be about 5.00% or a total of \$5,000. If you aggregated those with a single mutual fund company using comparable funds, the sales charge would reduce from 5.00% to 3.50% because of the breakpoint at \$100k. That savings of about \$1,500 would be invested rather than deducted for sales charges.

If you can commit to making additional investments within 12 months to reach a breakpoint, you can also qualify for the reduced sales charge immediately with a 'letter of intent' or 'rights of accumulation.' However, if you fail to make the additional investment, there will be an adjustment to your

account after 12 months to what would have been the correct sales charge.

Magnify Breakpoints by 'Householding'

Householding is frequently overlooked and enables investors to aggregate several family members' accounts to qualify for larger breakpoints when purchasing mutual funds. If your immediate family owns mutual funds with the same mutual fund provider such as Fidelity or American Funds, you may be able to aggregate them for breakpoint purposes.

For example, if you have substantial holdings with a mutual fund company and want to open 4 new 529 college savings accounts for your grandchildren, you may significantly reduce the sales charges through the use of householding. Why pay 5.75% when you open 4 small accounts at \$5,000 each when you may save hundreds of dollars in sales charges by householding your other accounts with the same mutual fund firm? And the reduced sales charges mean more money invested for the benefit of your grandchildren.

Sometimes householding is overlooked when your investment accounts are scattered between different brokerage or advisory firms, or funds held directly with a mutual fund company. Make sure the broker or adviser you are working with is aware of your other holdings so they can best advise you with regard to householding, breakpoints, and reducing your over costs of investing.

Take Advantage of Mutual Fund Exchanges

If you want to sell a fund in your portfolio, you don't necessarily need to sell it in your brokerage from fund company A and buy it from Company B and pay another sales or ticket charge. If the original fund company has extensive offerings, and there is a fund there that meets your investment objective, consider just exchanging it. That way you avoid sales or transaction charges.

Many claim "commissions are bad," but sometimes ongoing feebased investing isn't in the best interest of the client either. The truth is there's a lot of nuance to investment product and account pricing. Aligning those with the best interests of clients is of great value and a central duty of your financial professional.

The Greater Phoenix housing market is cooling, but it is far from cold. Putting the last 10 months into perspective from January 2021 to the end of October 2021, the overall supply of single-family residences in Paradise Valley has declined 18.5% and year-over-year we are down 34% in supply. Let's just say that it has been good to be a seller. While inventory remains an issue, there are indicators that demand is also cooling. Homes are beginning to sit on the market a little longer and there has been an uptick in price adjustments. Have we peaked? That is the million-dollar question. We are still seeing growth in price per square foot, but nowhere near the pace we saw earlier in the year. What we can agree on is that if you are planning to list your home and take advantage of this market, homes that have been updated and modernized are the homes that are selling quickly and for top dollar.

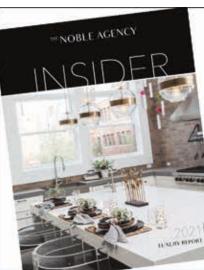

IBASY PASTA SAUCIB **Creamy Mushroom Sauce with Sundried Tomatoes**

This quick and easy Creamy Mushroom Pasta Sauce is so delicious! Perfectly cooked pasta tossed with sautéed mushrooms, garlic, and a rich and creamy coconut-based balsamic lemon butter sauce with fresh herbs. A perfect and filling weeknight recipe during the busy holiday season!

PREP TIME: 15 mins. COOK TIME: 15 mins.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tsp extra virgin olive oil (sub for ghee)
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 2 8oz. packages of cremini or white button mushrooms, sliced
- ¹/₂ cup sundried tomatoes, soaked and chopped
- 10 oz gluten-free brown rice pasta
- 1 tbsp ghee (can sub for vegan butter or butter)
- 3-4 tsp tapioca flour (can sub for potato starch)
- 2 tsp lemon juice
- 2 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1 tbsp coconut aminos
- 2 tsp dried thyme
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt
- ¹/₄ tsp black pepper
- 2 tsp fresh rosemary, chopped
- 1¹/₄ cup canned coconut milk
- ³/₄ cup mushroom broth, divided

INSTRUCTIONS

Prep your ingredients first. Chop garlic, wipe off excess dirt from mushrooms, and slice, chop, and soak the sundried tomatoes.

Then cook the pasta to your liking, in boiling salted water according to box instructions.

In a large saucepan, heat 1 tsp of olive oil over medium heat, add the garlic, and sauté for 1 minute. Add the sliced mushrooms, 1/4 cup of the mushroom broth, and sauté for 5 min. or until mushrooms have cooked down a bit.

Remove mushrooms from the pan with all the liquid. Next create your roux by melting 1 tbsp ghee or butter, then whisk in 4 tsp flour/starch until smooth. Allow it to bubble for at least 1 minute while mixing. Then add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of mushroom broth and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup canned coconut milk, mix together, and lower the heat. Then bring to a simmer for 2-3 min.

Now add back the mushrooms, chopped and drained sun-dried tomatoes, salt, pepper, thyme, fresh rosemary, balsamic vinegar, and coconut aminos. Give it a good stir and let it simmer for about 5 min. to allow it to thicken.

Add the cooked pasta to the mushroom sauce and combine. Allow to simmer for 3 min. until flavors combine. Shut off the heat and add fresh lemon juice to bring all the flavors together.

TIPS AND SUBSTITUTIONS

Add lemon juice at the end once you turn off the heat. Mushroom Broth: Feel free to substitute with veggie broth.

Oscar is known for his mastery of style. He consulted for the interior designer of AZ/88's elegant, minimal interior with its movable works of art and gallery installations that are constantly changing. He points to the colossal hanging disco ball style sculpture that star-lights the space, encapsulating the senses outwardly while the restroom design experience "makes you feel as if you have just stepped inside of a disco ball." This is where everyone knows Oscar and where he threw his milestone birthday party - and why after sharing his stories, the mayor of Phoenix declared June 29th to become officially known as "OSCAR DAY."

Born in Colombia, Oscar left Bogota after graduating with a master's in architecture from the Universidad Piloto de Colombia to continue his education and pursue a master's degree in interior architecture in Europe, just outside of Madrid, Spain at the renowned University of Salamanca - the second oldest university in the world after Oxford. He lived several years in Europe filing for an internship with an interior design company called Cassina based in Italy and from there took off traveling to Paris, Milan, Madrid, London... He worked in several countries as a consultant for interior architecture for the United States Federal Building Office and served as Interior Finishes Project Manager for the United States Embassies and coordinated projects in Lima, Singapore, and Guantanamo, Cuba. Oscar wanted to grab everything, "Three months here, four months, six months there - it was the time of my life that I produced a lot of stuff out of my imagination!"

One weekend, in an underground little pub, Oscar met a photographer, who asked if he could help them design a set – "you know, like put stuff in the background and I was like, are you paying? Yeah, okay, I'll bring it tomorrow." He began weekend work with the agency in Milan where Mario Testino was the head photographer. Oscar created backgrounds for photoshoots and styled models for fashion editorials. When they discovered he had a background as a model at age 18, they also signed him up to do model work for catalogs. "Every weekend I made extra money - I was still a student, so I could use the money." Oscar recalls creating the staging for a photoshoot outside of an abandoned 16th century Church of San Gaetano in Padua, Italy (Hawthorne's setting of Rappaccini's Daughter) - a beautiful background for the future wife of a millionaire. Oscar worked nonstop designing interiors during the week for the firms and creating sets on the weekend, all the while postponing his thesis project. Finally, he received a letter from the Dean that he needed to make a decision about his thesis, "So I was always wanting to write about Frank Lloyd Wright. I wanted to go to Chicago, but I didn't know anybody in Chicago at the time. I wrote him back and he said the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture at Taliesin West is about an hour from Phoenix, AZ. I know someone there, Perfect! I said, I'm going to go for six months, and come back to Madrid for my job

interview with the production company. It was August 18th, 1998. I landed with four suitcases, two were my clothes (for each season, of course!) and two suitcases filled with my books, sketchbooks, class notes, rulers, squares, colors, and my diaries -I just landed in the inside of an oven!"

Oscar soon realized that his thesis was going to take longer than he expected. He sent a note to the Dean asking for an extension. Soon after, he met an architect who was looking for someone to do drawings, Oscar interviewed for the position, and they started the filing process for his work visa. He got his CCS and then he began to get more work and after 12 years he finalized his visa and his citizenship. Oscar is very proud of this, "It was a lot because a work visa is for specialized workers, so I had to go through the process of having to put ads in magazines and newspapers, careful to not take away any jobs from qualified citizens - It was a very long process." Returning to his passion for design, Oscar served as principal of the modern architecture firm, Architectural Alliance Inc. and lead numerous municipal projects in Arizona including the award-winning Peoria Fire Station 196 - Vistancia.

Oscar has since gone on to stamp his elevated style to know what was going on - I had several offers from national as The Renaissance Man of the Modern World networks and magazines were asking me to write about fashion Designer, Fashion Producer, Style Critic, Writer, but I was already working as an architect. It was crazy." and Creative Director. He is online and on TV, he chairs galas and attends all the big social events, Today, Oscar speaks of the importance of finding balance in life he is a board member of the Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art as well as the Friends of Phoenix by creating quality time for each aspect of living. This includes quality time for him and his own version of family with the other Public Art and he still contracts for the multinational design and architecture firm he works for. two that make the perfect trifecta; His all-American dream husband Gary Jackson and their now elder pug of 14 years - Hugo. "I put all my talents to work. For me, everything is designed - from the coffee that you make, to the music that you listen to, and the spaces you inhabit. It's like a James Bond movie, everything feels personalized for you. That is the maximum level that humans can be in luxury as we know today - the maximum expression of design."

posting on FB which is still my journal today. Everyone wanted



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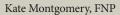
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Name, gender, and age of pet: Charly is a female Yorkshire Terrier age 5.5 years old

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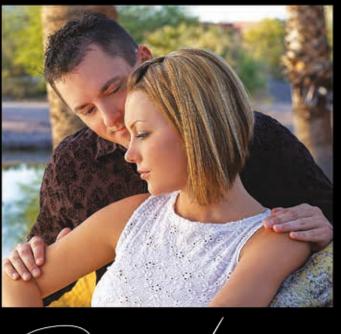
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
