GEOGRAPHY

Quintana Roo stretches along the eastern coast of the Yucatán Peninsula, caressed by the Caribbean Sea's gentle waves. The state's geography is diverse, with coastal plains giving way to flat terrains dotted with cenotes and underground rivers. Mangroves and lagoons dot the coastline, while further inland, tropical jungles flourish, sheltering a vast array of flora and fauna.

CITIES & NOTABLE DESTINATIONS:

CANCÚN: Often the first name that springs to mind when one thinks of Quintana Roo, Cancún is a world-renowned resort city. Known for its vibrant nightlife, luxury resorts, and stunning beaches, it's a magnet for tourists and investors alike.

PLAYA DEL CARMEN: Once a quiet fishing town, Playa del Carmen has evolved into cosmopolitan beach destination. Its famed 5th Avenue, a pedestrian only thoroughfare, buzzes with restaurants, shops, and entertainment venues.

TULUM: A harmonious blend of ancient and modern. While it's home to one of the best-preserved Mayan coastal ruins, it's also a hub for eco-tourism and spiritual wellness retreats.

COZUMEL: An island paradise known for its coral reefs and dive spots, Cozumel attracts divers and snorkelers from around the globe.

Importance of MESOAMERICAN REEF, the second largest worldwide

The Mesoamerican reef is considered one of the most biologically diverse ecosystems on the planet. It is the largest reef system in the Atlantic Ocean and the second worldwide. It extends from the Yucatan Peninsula in southeastern Mexico, passes through Belize and Guatemala and reaches Honduras.

Two representative sites of the Mesoamerican reef in Quintana Roo are the **Sian Ka'an biosphere reserves** and **Banco Chinchorro**.

The reefs of Sian Ka'an 29 make up a complex of coral reefs with **potential geomorphology** scientific, economic, tourist, educational, fishing, historical and cultural. Various formations stand out here corals whose massifs measure up to twelve meters height in its most developed part; they are inhabited by a diversity of associated species.






CENOTES & SAC ACTUN SYSTEM

GEOGRAPHY OF QUINTANA ROO

In addition to our spectacular white-sand beaches and turquoise blue sea, one of the greatest attractions of the Mexican Caribbean are without a doubt the cenotes. These fascinating natural pools of intense cobalt blue, turquoise blue, or emerald green color leave anyone who dares to explore them breathless.

The cenotes are exclusively found in the Yucatan Peninsula (in Mexico), Belize, and Guatemala, where the soil is porous and soft limestone, which allowed rainwater to seep in and create an underground system of rivers called the Sac Actun System. The largest underground river system in the world, located along the Mexican Caribbean, connects all the cenotes.



The coast of Quintana Roo, known as the Mexican Caribbean, and since 2016 a federal Biosphere Reserve that covers 5,754,055 hectares.


The Mexican Caribbean begins at Cabo Catoche (at the northern tip of the Yucatan Peninsula) and ends to the south at the border with Belize.





NORTH AREA

The first is the Northern Zone that covers the municipalities of Lázaro Cárdenas, Isla Mujeres, Benito Juárez, Puerto Morelos, Solidaridad and Cozumel. The second is the Central Zone, which covers the municipalities of Tulum and Felipe Carrillo Puerto, including the Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve. And the third is located in the municipality of Othón P. Blanco and will be called the South Zone.





NORTH AREA



It is a National Park, administered by the National Commission of Protected Natural Areas (CONANP). The southern tip of **Isla Contoy** marks the beginning of the Mesoamerican Reef System, the largest in America.

ISLA MUJERES


Which is part of the Costa Occidental National Park of Isla Mujeres, Punta Cancún and Punta Nizuc where a large number of species of flora and fauna live.

COZUMEL

The third island in the northern area with one of the most important archaeological remains of the State of Quintana Roo, which is also the largest island in Mexico. In the central southern part of this island is the Arrecifes de Cozumel National Park and in the central-north the Cozumel Island Flora and Fauna Protection Area.

ARROWSMITH BANK

It is a submerged reef platform, located east of **Punta Cancún**, in a transition zone between the biotic provinces of the **Caribbean Sea** and the **Gulf of Mexico**, in the northern part of the **Mexican Caribbean Biosphere Reserve**.






MIDDLE AREA

It develops from the municipality of Tulum to that corresponding to Felipe Carrillo Puerto. The main population within this area is Tulum, a city in increasing development, and the Mayan area concentrated from Muyil, Chumpon, Felipe Carrillo and Uh May, among others, and in the coastal area Punta Allen.

It includes the area of the **Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve** also declared a
World Heritage Site by the United
Nations Educational, Scientific and
Cultural Organization (UNESCO) due
to the importance of its ecosystems.





SOUTH AREA

It spans from Punta Pulticub to the Xcalak Arrecifes National Park in the southern part of the state of Quintana Roo. It is located in the municipality of Othón P. Blanco, whose main city is Chetumal, capital of the state of Quintana Roo. Mahahual is a town in growing development, and docking point for tourist cruises.

It includes the southern part of the Mexican Caribbean Biosphere Reserve and the Banco Chinchorro Biosphere Reserve in the open sea as important lobster and queen conch fishing sites. This area of the state is home to 3 tourist destinations: Mahahual, Bacalar and Chetumal.
